A. General Works on the Mind Sciences

Note: Mind science writers often use the term *New Thought* in reference to all mind sciences.

1. Books Supporting the Mind Sciences

Mosley, Glenn R. *New Thought, Ancient Wisdom: The History and Future of the New Thought Movement*. West Conshohocken, NJ: Templeton Foundation Press, 2006. Provides an overview of the movement, though clearly emphasizing the Fillmores and Unity.

The Prosperity Bible: Landmark Writings on the Incredible Prospering Power of the Human Mind. New York: Jeremy P. Tarcher, 2007. An anthology of books from such notables as Ralph Waldo Trine, Charles Fillmore, Emmet Fox, Ernest Holmes, and Napoleon Hill, along with non-mind science thinkers like Benjamin Franklin.

Seale, Ervin. *Mingling Minds: Phineas Parkhurst Quimby's Science of Health & Happiness*. Camarillo, CA: DeVorss, 1997. Study of Quimby, from whom Mary Baker Eddy took much of her "revelation" of Christian Science.

Meyer, Donald E. *The Positive Thinkers: Religion as Pop Psychology from Mary Baker Eddy to Oral Roberts*. New York: Pantheon Books, 1980. Chronicles the history of positive thinking in American religion; several of the thinkers profiled here are mind scientists.

Gill, Gillian. *Mary Baker Eddy*. Radcliffe Biography Series. Cambridge: Perseus Books, 1998. Sympathetic biography by a non-Christian Scientist, emphasizing Eddy as an early feminist.

Fraser, Caroline. *God's Perfect Child: Living and Dying in the Christian Science Church*. With a new Afterword. New York: Henry Holt, 2000. Former Christian Scientist's well-received historical study of Christian Science and the issue of faith healing.

Gardner, Martin. *The Healing Revelations of Mary Baker Eddy: The Rise and Fall of Christian Science*. Buffalo, NY: Prometheus Books, 1993. By a well-known skeptic.

Hoekema, Anthony A. *Christian Science*. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1963. Written by an astute evangelical theologian. Also part of his book, *The Four Major Cults*.

Kramer, Linda S. *The Religion that Kills: Christian Science: Abuse, Neglect, and Mind Control*. Lafayette, LA: Huntington House, 2000. Controversial book in which former Christian Scientist who came to faith in Christ argues that Christian Science exhibits eight marks of mind control identified by Robert Jay Lifton. An appendix presents a useful comparison of Christian Science with biblical Christianity.

Schoepflin, Rennie B. *Christian Science on Trial: Religious Healing in America*. Medicine, Science, and Religion in Historical Context. Baltimore: Johns Hopkins University Press, 2003. Attempts an even-handed, historical analysis.

Fox, Emmet. *Diagrams for Living: The Bible Unveiled*. New York: Harper & Row, 1968.

Posthumously published book providing instruction for reading the Bible esoterically.

_____. *Power through Constructive Thinking*. New York: HarperCollins, 2009. Originally published in 1932. Fox may have been the pastor of America's first megachurch; he had over five thousand attending his Divine Science church during the Depression.

_____. *The Sermon on the Mount: The Key to Success in Life*. New York: HarperCollins, 1989. Orig. 1934. An enormously popular book that continues to sell well today.
